

- ◆ The church is built in the shape of a cross called a CRUCIFORM.
  - Why do you think this might be?

- ◆ Time to start exploring! We're going to start in the NAVE (5) of the church where the congregation sit. Walk down the side aisle to the left of the main door. Can you spot the small window on your left? Well done! This is called the LANCET WINDOW (13) and is the only one left from the 13<sup>th</sup> century building so it's very, very old!
  - Who can you see in the window?

- ◆ Keep walking down the North aisle until you come to a space on your left. You've reached the MEMORIAL CHAPEL (12). The window in the chapel is made from fragments of glass many of which are from medieval times and the 17<sup>th</sup> century.

- Have a look around here and see if you can work out why it's called the Memorial Chapel. There are some clues on the wall to help you.

- ◆ The men from Gamlingay Heath and Tetworth served in different regiments.
  - Can you list them?

- ◆ Time to move on. Can you spot a hole in the pillar to the right of the altar in the Memorial Chapel? This is called a SQUINT HOLE or, HAGIOSCOPE, to give it its proper name. It was used so people sitting in the side of the church could see what was happening at the main altar.
